## Reunification is Possible!

This year we had a mom who was fiercely committed to changing her life! She took all the steps necessary, including difficult ones, to make sure she was safe and protective of her child. They were reunified and are now thriving!

## Generosity of a Community

Hill County always steps up for our children! This year, we had a family in need of beds, so the children could remain with family after being removed from their mother. A generous individual purchased a bed and a generous business in Whitney donated 2 mattresses. This all happened in a matter of hours!

## If not for CASA

Two children were placed with family, after several months in Foster Care. It was our CASA Advocate who noticed the children beginning to drastically change, becoming quiet and withdrawn. After advocating with CPS for a better look into the case, it was discovered that the children were being mistreated. These children were able to move back to their previous foster home and were adopted in late 2024! Upon their return to this placement, they exclaimed "We are HOME!"
